Hello Wildcats,

In just a couple of weeks we will have completed the first quarter of school. Time flies when you're having fun!

In addition to a few new literacy courses this year—psychology, sports sociology, mythology, and 6th Grade Success—we have also implemented a student Lighthouse course. The students in this course are fast becoming leaders in the building. They are creating a positive culture and developing a plan that encourages students to be accountable for their learning, their actions, and their own decision making.

This year our teachers and students are using a program called Castle. You will find it on the Launchpad page of your student's Chromebook. Through Castle, our teachers, students, and you, can track your child's grades, schedule, discipline records, positive behavior records, student requested passes, and track how your student is performing on the Florida State Standards. This last part is something new and we are all working through the details and challenges of how to best monitor students' progress. As educators and parents, we all want to ensure that our students are progressing well and are ready for the challenges of the next school year.

Monitoring their progress through state standards enables us to know and act on that information. It is our goal to help you prepare your child for their future.

On another note, we will continue with our Diplomat Lock-ins this year. These three events will last four hours, 4:00-8:00pm, and include a dance, movies, laser tag, dodgeball, and more. To participate students must meet two requirements, 1. Earn only As, Bs, and Cs, on their report cards, and 2. have no discipline referrals this school year. The first Lock-in will happen a couple of weeks after the end of quarter one. Be on the lookout for information coming soon.

One more thing...we are always interested in having parent volunteers. If you have a couple of hours a month, or per quarter, we would love to have you assist in the copy room, at the front desk, become a part of our School Advisory Committee, or help with our book fairs. 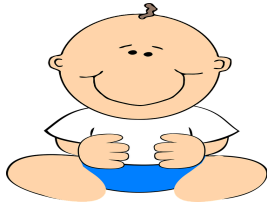
